

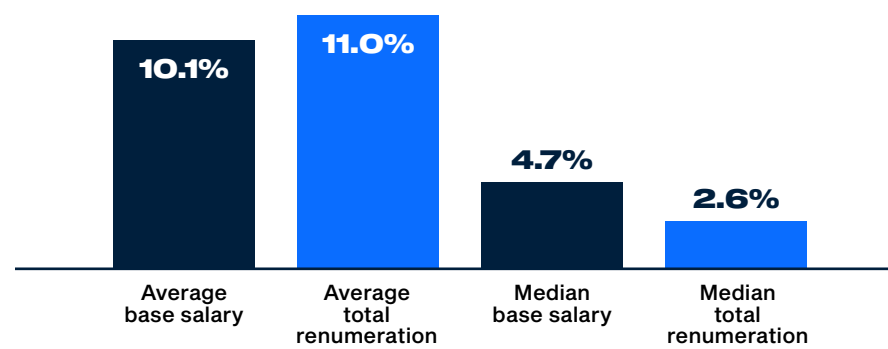

50 per cent of the Tennis Australia Participation budget is invested in women and girls.

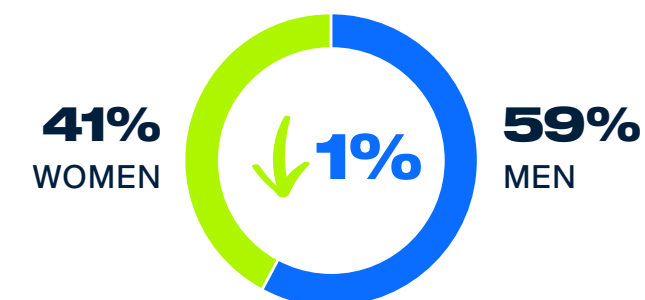
PERFORMANCE BUDGET



48 per cent of the Tennis Australia Performance and Player Development budget is invested in women and girls.

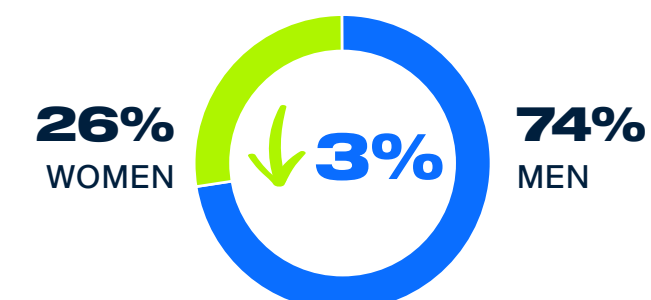

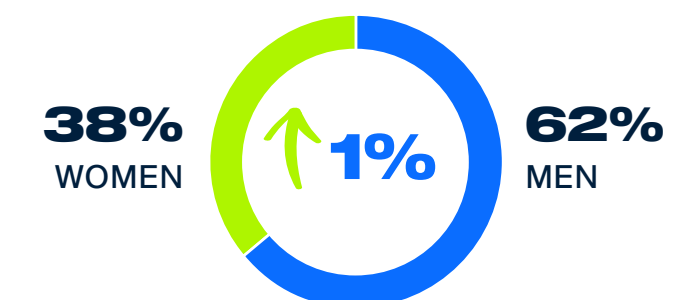

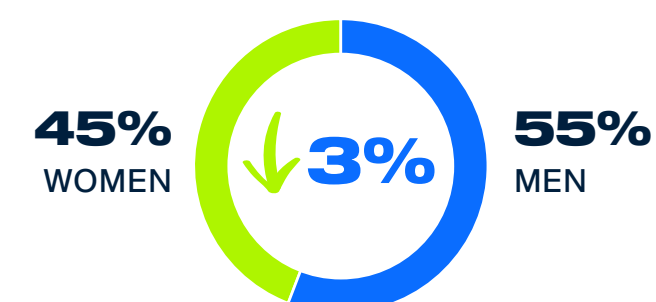

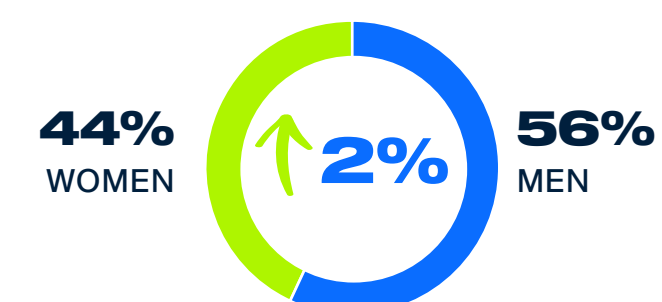

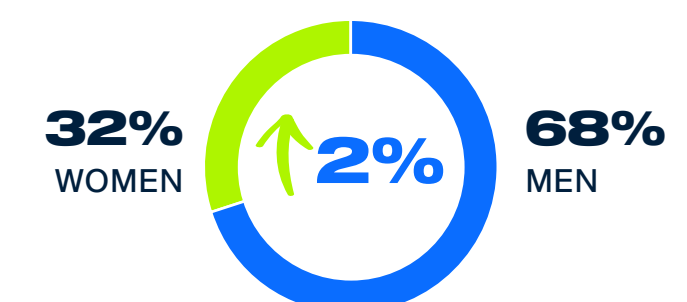

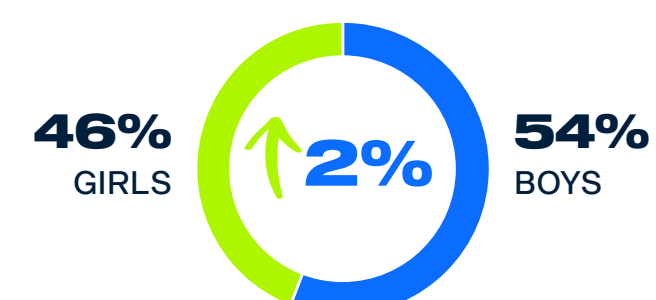

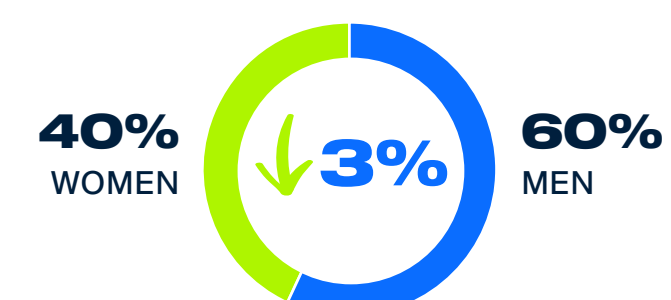
